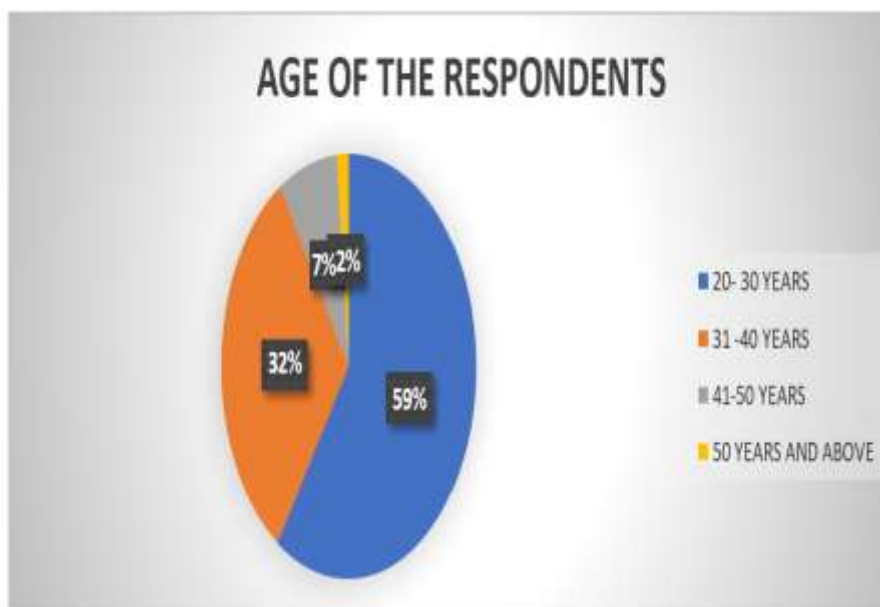

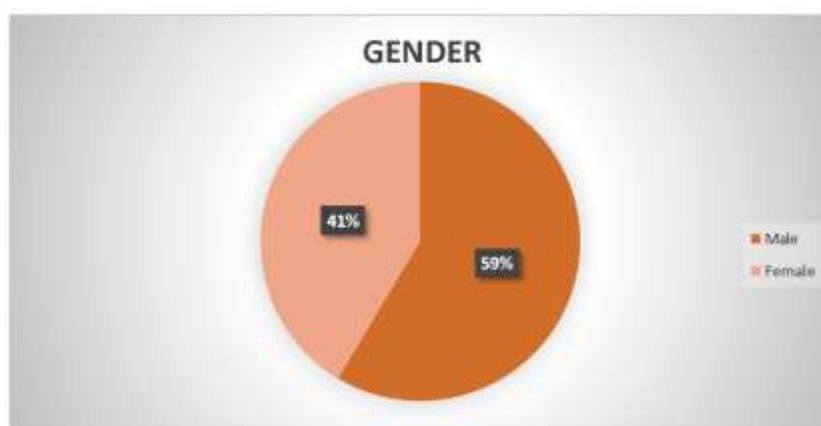
IV. RESULTS & DISCUSSION
